This would be the first of many weeks of VBS for these students, because the next several weeks they traveled to the mountain regions among the **Chinanteco**, **Cuicateco**, and **Nahualt** indigenous groups. They went out in teams of two and held week long VBS in the remote villages. One of the situations they ran into was the need for more things to do and teach the kids, because

they did not want to go home after the planned VBS classes and activities were over. The children wanted to stay with their teachers and keep learning and having activities. So the VBS turned into an all-day teaching affair, giving great opportunity for deeply planting the basic truths of God's Word in the hearts of hundreds of children. We know that as our students obeyed the call of God to go to these places and






ones, bringing many of them to know the Lord Jesus through the Bible teachings. The theme of the VBS was "Surviving in the Desert." They learned spiritual lessons from the history of the Israelites wanderings in Exodus and how their provisions of Water, Bread, Guidance, and Victory all point towards our provision in Christ Jesus for salvation and all things pertaining to our lives as Christians.

Also this past month, we had the opportunity to once again serve with our friends from the Medical Mission Team of Broadmoor Baptist Church of Shreveport, LA. Brethren from this church have been obeying the Call of God to serve the people of Mexico for a week each summer for over thirty years! Each day, two clinics at two different sites were set up and held in rural and low-income areas in the Cordoba region. Hundreds of people came to the clinics to receive medical consultations, medicines, reading glasses, clothes, toys, all given with the love of Christ and in the Name of

Jesus. At the clinics, a clear presentation of the Gospel is given to young and old. There is prayer with each patient receiving treatment and they know that they are loved. This, of course, requires a great investment in time, resources, purchasing medications and





said he could see the "love of God" in the way everyone was treated. We thank the Lord for Broadmoor Church. Dr. Tom **Harrison**, BBC's executive pastor, led this team along with several other staff members including Dr. Larry Williams, who brought the first team down in the early 1980s. Drs. Mook and Rozeman, veterans of many mission trips here to Mexico, were joined this year by Dr. E.B. Robinson, heading up the medical side of the clinics. Because of this service, doors are opened for the Gospel proclamation. Doors of hearts of individuals and doors to entire towns where there is no church or group of believers are opened. God has used this "method" among us for many years since the beginning of the MITC ministry over 60 years ago. We thank the Lord for allowing medical ministries to still be a means of blessing for the people of Mexico. To God be the glory for this work among us.

Bible Chapel of Delhi Hills sent a team led by Pastor Kevin Landis, Kara Landis and Dan Stout to help with our "on-Campus VBS." Working alongside Alfredo Arce (MITC Staff) and the





second-year students, the helpers from this group participated each day in the skits for the Bible Story, helped take children from one station to another and also helped serving the refreshments. However, not only did they work at the VBS on campus, but the Lord used them to staff two other VBS at churches at **La Cumbre and Orizaba**. Meanwhile, the men of this group worked in the carpentry shop, welding shop, construction, painting and also sewing projects. We made a trip up to the mountain village of **Aculcinapa** where the group helped work on a bathroom for the church (to



replace the wooden latrines...). It was a week with many blessings from the Lord. There is always something for each of our missionaries to do in the service of the Lord while on mission here at MITC. God uses the obedient hearts that He is working in and each person as they are working out the call to serve God and others.

Thank you so much for your faithfulness in praying and supporting the work of God here at MITC. God is using **you** to keep the ministry among us advancing, blessing us with the necessary means to keep the Bible Schools, the Christian Music School and the many different outreach ministries going for the Glory of God and the advancement of His Gospel here in Mexico. May we continue to obey the Call together.
