Since they were also here (in addition to the 2nd and 3rd year students) for our Vacation Bible School Workshop, one of the initial activities upon arrival to their place of service was to hold a VBS or several Bible Clubs, using the theme and materials of the VBS. Literally teaching the next generation of "teachers of the Word". Of course they are also teaching adults, and youth, in homes, church, and sharing the Gospel in public areas as God provides opportunities Please continue to pray for them: **Kevin** in Santa Maria Papalo, **German** in Teponapa, Santiago in Xoxocotla, Daniela in Aculcinapa, Sinai in Jiquipilas, and **Areli** in Berriozabal, and Alejandro in Cacique.
