Dear brethren and Friends,

Youth are a great part of the Ministry of MITC. Of course, our Full time Bible School program is focused on training young people starting their ministerial process who confess a call of God upon their lives to serve full time. We are able to provide intensive Bible Studies and practical ministry training in this four-year program along with food and housing. All





this is possible by the grace of God, through each of you who lovingly support MITC, and we are able to give this free of charge to all our students in the spirit of "by grace we have received and by grace we give". This is very important as many of our students come from the mountain and remote areas and have very limited finances. However, the last year of their training is a year of service during which we are able to send them as missionaries to one of the remote areas of MITC ministry, this is one of the ways our students "give back" for the blessing received during their time on campus. After their year of service they graduate and are available for full-time ministry positions as the Lord leads.

The Easter Youth Camp in the town of Usila up in the Chinanteco mountains was a huge blessing. Almost 200 youth from the Chinanteco, Mixe, and Cuicateco, Indian regions along with youth from some from churches of Cordoba, all made their way to this event specially planned by the Village Mountain churches to encourage the youth in their faith and walk with the Lord. **Brandon Hall** was the preacher for this event, many were moved by the Word of God as they studied the Book of Daniel together, the emphasis was to seek the realities of God's eternal kingdom in Christ versus the digital, virtual, or temporal things of this life. Several MITC alumni missionaries, and pastors helped to counsel and lead the youth present. The church of Usila and Pastor Marco Deseano (MITC alumni) hosted the event, the **ladies of the church** helped by cooking the traditional meals for the kids attending. It was a tremendously hot week and the Usila river was a huge help for cooling off, cleaning up, and to have some recreational activities in the water. During the camp, many youth expressed a desire to serve the Lord, and we hope and pray that we will see some of these come to the Bible School in the upcoming school year.



The **youth from Lakes** church in Florida came for a week of hard work and ministry serving the Lord here at MITC. It is always a blessing to see young people who are at this crucial time in their lives of decision making. To have them come and share in the work of the Lord and get to know our full-time Bible students working along them in the on-campus chores and also in some of their ministry assignments. It is a great opportunity for the Lord to speak to them in a special way giving them an enlarged world view and greater appreciation for the Great Commission. This team helped with a much-needed repair on a 50-year-old on one of our walls that was falling on our neighbor's property, The kids helped demolish the old and then dig and set the

foundations of the new wall. We are thankful for God's provision through this team and Lakes Church for helping with this special project.

Brother Arce (MITC staff member) attended the inauguration of the new building for the church in La Alianza way up in the mountains in the Chinanteco region. This is a mission started through MITC missionaries many years ago and is presently pastored by one of our Alumni and graduate from MITC, David and his wife Marbella also one of our alumni. The brethren of this church gave a tremendous effort in work and of their means, and the Lord blessed their endeavor to have a new place to worship together. It was a special time of celebration for this church, and they were joined by brethren from several other MITC churches/missions in the region to praise the Lord together. One of our year in practice students, Emanuel, has been





helping with the preaching and teaching in this church and several other works in the area.

As these churches grow and the buildings are built, there is a need for seating for the growing number of members. That is why we are thankful for the team from southern Texas the **Ambassadors for Christ of Texas**, who come each year and help us build sets of **church pews** to give to the many works that are under the MITC scope of ministry. Once again, this team came led by Terry Boening and Randy Miller, and built over 20 pews that will be a great blessing for the churches in Neria, Monteblanco, and for Encinal in the Mixe region.







Dentistry has been a very useful tool to open doors for the Gospel throughout the history of MITC. In the beginning it was all about doing extractions of bad and hurting teeth, now with the advancement of technology, dental equipment has become portable and we are now able to take full clinic services to many people and to remote areas. We are thankful to the Lord for His provision through our Baton Rouge dental team Led by Cody Cowen, Michael Juban, and Joe Yates, who come each year to continue in the dental evangelistic efforts with us here at MITC. This year they brought their teenage children to help with the dental ministry and we were able to help over 250 people with all types of dental issues. They did fillings, cleanings, extractions and dental repairs. We organized clinics here in our auditorium on campus, and also up in the Nahuatl mountains in the village of Acultzinapa. The Gospel was shared by our students and staff with the patients and family members were waiting to be seen. The love of the Lord Jesus was shared in a mighty way through these brethren. We were also blessed by pastor Daniel Hernandez and his daughter Joy, and Jonathan who came from Broadmoor Baptist and helped translate for these dentists.

Chuy and I are greatly thankful to the Lord for God's blessing upon our family and for the arrival of our new baby grandson born to our son William and his wife Fernanda. **Baby Lucas Hall** is in great health and growing rapidly. We praise the Lord for His blessings.



Thank you for your loving prayers and support, the Lord uses it to enable us to serve him here at MITC, and in this way continue to advance the Gospel of Jesus Christ and be a blessing to the people of Mexico. May the Lord bless you and continue to use us together for His glory.
