After all their training here in the classrooms and short term weekend and week-long ministries, they will now be going "out" to serve for a year, in a church or mission assigned by the MITC faculty. We always have more requests for students than we can provide, therefore we continue to **pray** that the Lord will keep calling and raising up servants to come and prepare in the Bible Schools and then go forth to serve in the Name of Jesus Christ. The names of our students and their places of assignment are the following: **Luis Enrique** in Tequila and Atlajco among the Nahuatl indians, **Ismerai** in Usila among the Chinantecos, **Belem** in Jalapa working with one of our graduate pastors, **Ulises** in Xoxocotla and Tecalatzompa, and **Kari** in Aculcinapa, and **Ruth** in Guerrero among the Tlapanecos, and **Deyanira** among the Chinantecos in Rio Manzo.

Please keep them in your prayers as they serve the Lord in these areas during all this school year. Some will be interim pastors, others missionaries, children workers, youth leaders, etc. and they will all be Bible teachers. After they finish this year of service, then they will graduate next year.

One of our last summer activities was the annual Music Camp held by our Christian Music School. This week during the summer allows people of all ages (although there are many children), to come and learn the basic principles of music and of several instruments. There is also a weeklong Bible Study in which the Gospel is shared with all those attending. Many of those who come to the Camp return to start in the fall semester as students in the Christian Music School.

To start off the new school year we are thankful to the Lord for bringing a good group of students to prepare for ministry in both the Full-Time live on campus program and also in our Saturday Seminary Bible School. To start the 2022-2023 school year we have a total of 84 ministry students enrolled in the 2 programs, with 33 students in first year. Thank you for your prayers for workers for the ministry, God is answering and calling them to come and study and become teachers to others.

Joining us for the beginning of the school year we had a multi-state group, that came to help us with our work on ongoing maintenance and construction projects, they came from Stonepoint Church in Texas, Liberty Heights church in Ohio, and FBC Hartsville IN. This team helped continue the work on the addition to Jimmy and Leslie's home, and also did work on the new VCM-2 building. **Gary Richardson, Eber Flores, and Archie Engeldow**, (leaders from these churches), were part of our commissioning meeting where our 4th year students received their assignments for the year of practice.

The meeting is always a special time of prayer, and encouragement in the Word of God, and of course it is when the students find out where they will be stationed for the upcoming year.

At the end of the month of September we had our first "missions week" of the new school year, this a time of short term ministry when our **3rd and 2nd year students** go and serve at a remote mission for an 11 day period covering 2 Sundays. During this "missions week" we are able to send our students to 4 of the indigenous regions where we have our Mountain Village churches, among the Chinantecos, Mixes, Cuicateco, and Nahuatl people groups. It is also a time of training for our full-time Bible School students, as there is a close supervision and reporting with/from these churches in the mountains.

Eduardo is a young man from the city of Puebla, and was called to full time service and came to train for the ministry here at MITC in 2012. while he was here he met a Chinanteco girl named Yolis, they both graduated in 2016, and a little over a year later they got married and began to look for a place to serve full time in the ministry. God opened the door to serve at Santiago Tlatepusco, one of our missions in the Chinanteco region up in the mountains above the town of Usila, Oaxaca. They have been serving there for several years, and the church organized a special ordination service for him, we had the blessing and opportunity to be with them and lay hands on Eduardo, asking God to use him for His glory as the pastor of the church. We are thankful to see the purpose of MITC being fulfilled right before our eyes.
