For I want you to know how great a struggle I have on your behalf and for those who are at Laodicea, and for all those who have not personally seen my face, that their hearts may be encouraged, having been knit together in love, and attaining to all the wealth that comes from the full assurance of understanding, resulting in a true knowledge of God's mystery, that is, Christ Himself, in whom are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge. I say this so that no one will delude you with persuasive argument. Therefore as you have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him, having been firmly rooted and now being built up in Him and established in your faith, just as you were instructed, and overflowing with gratitude.

Colossians 2:1-4,6,7 (NASB)

Hello beloved friends and brethren,

In the preceding text we see the apostle Paul's concern for the spiritual well-being of the brethren in Colossae. Even though he was in prison, he struggled in his spirit praying for them and then writing this epistle to help them continue grounded and growing in the true Gospel and rooted in the word of God. There were many confusing teachings going around in the first Christian century and today things have only gotten worse. There are many false religions that deny that Jesus Christ is God in the flesh and that his death on the cross is the only means of salvation. They deny that the work of Christ is sufficient for the forgiveness of sins past, present and future. So these false religions subtract from the Person and Work of Christ and add other religious requirements for men's salvation.



Such is the situation encountered by our "year in practice" student José or Pepe, who is working up in the Náhualt mountain region, sharing the gospel and teaching of salvation by grace through faith in Christ alone. God is blessing Pepe as he serves along his wife Eva (also a graduate from MITC). They serve primarily in the town of Xoxocotla in the recently established church in this place, but he also teaches in the new mission of Tecalatzompa and helps with the preaching in Aculcinapa. There are two main religious groups that are present in this region and they try to sway the brethren from their faith in Christ as taught in the Scriptures. Both groups deny the sufficiency of the work of Christ and seek to add many extra "works" to obtain a right standing before God. The Lord is giving Pepe grace to deal with these who oppose the clear teaching of the Bible and also seeks to lead them to the liberating and saving Truth in Christ. Jose is nicknamed "Pepe Pollos" (something like Joe Chickens) because of the means he uses to support his family while studying and now while serving as a student missionary in his fourth year in the Full-Time Bible School Program.

He lives at the base of the Nahualt mountain village region and there has his chicken rotisserie business (very tasty...). While at school Eva has run the business and when they both travel up the mountain they have someone else to help run things. Keep them in your prayers as they travel on the mountain roads to be with these brethren and as they seek to establish them more and more in the faith. Also remember Pepe and Eva as they share the gospel with those who still have not believed in Christ as their Lord and Savior.

This past month we had the blessing of starting off our 2019-2020 school year with a group led by brother **Gary Richardson**. The team was from the states of **Indiana**, **Ohio and Texas**. Gary brought Pastors **Tim Tallent**, **Eber Flores and Archie Manning** who preached and taught in local area churches and in the Chapel services here on campus. The team also worked very hard on projects here on campus, including starting the foundation for our new building (Villa/Classroom/Musical) for additional classrooms and housing spaces, They also made church pews for brethren in the **Chinanteco** mountain region and helped with painting projects.





One day during the week, we took the team up to the mountain village of **Tecalatzompa** where they helped with the foundation wall for the church building at this new mission. It was great to see these preachers and brethren from six different churches working hard, both at building a foundation literally (in the new VCM2 building) and also spiritually building upon the foundation of **Jesus Christ** teaching and preaching His Word. We are thankful for the help and provision for the Lord's work from these brethren from the north.









Next, we had a missionary Dental Team from Woodcreek Church in Richardson, TX led by Dr. Chris Miller, with his son Mike, Dr. Jack Bodie and a group of support staff from the church. God used this team, as many times before, to get into a "new" town for the Gospel called Aculcinapa-Atzompa, where there had previously been strong sentiments against any presence and work of evangelical Christians.





But because of the good testimony of the Dental Team through the years in this region, we were invited to go and help the people of the town and share the Gospel openly. In this we see fulfilled the scripture from 1Pet 2:12, "Keep your behavior excellent among the Gentiles, so that in the thing in which they slander you as evildoers, they may because of your good deeds, as they observe them, glorify God in the day of visitation." Praise the Lord for his goodness. This team also worked untiringly from early till dark in two other towns (Tepatlazco, Monteblanco) enhancing the testimony of the message of the Love of Christ with their actions. While they served with their dental skills and supplies, our Bible students worked teaching the children, youth and adults salvation in Jesus. Praise the Lord for these co-laborers with us in the Gospel.



Also this past month, Chuy and I had the privilege of visiting some churches in **Shreveport**, **LA** and also in **Richardson**, **TX** where we were able to share from the Word of God and also regarding the work of God here at MITC in Mexico. We thank the Lord for the warm welcome in the churches and also for the kind hospitality of our hosts while in the US for this week of visitation. Praise the Lord for His family both in the US and here in Mexico.

We thank each one of you who are our partners in ministry. Please continue through your prayers, financial support, by visits to serve here among us and each and every way that God leads you to give of his blessings to serve Him and His Gospel in Mexico. May the Lord be glorified in all we do. Gracias.
